**A RESOLUTION OF MANCHESTER BOROUGH ADOPTING A STREET SWEEPING
POLICY FOR MANCHESTER BOROUGH RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES**

WHEREAS, the Manchester Borough (the “Borough”) Council is authorized by Sections 1006 (4) and 3301.1(c) of the Borough Code to adopt a resolution enacting certain bylaws, policies and procedures of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council desires to adopt a Street Sweeping Policy to establish procedures for municipal street sweeping operations in order to promote public safety, improve stormwater management, improve water quality, and maintain the appearance and conditions of Borough roadways.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of Manchester Borough, York County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

STREET SWEEPING POLICY

PURPOSE AND APPLICABILITY

The purpose of this policy is to establish standardized procedures for municipal street sweeping operations within Manchester Borough. The street sweeping program is intended to promote public safety by maintaining clear and safe roadways, improve stormwater management and protect water quality, reduce debris, dust, and pollutants from entering the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4), and maintain the appearance and overall condition of Borough roadways and infrastructure.

This policy shall apply to all municipally owned streets and designated public roadways within Manchester Borough. It also applies to residents, visitors, and property owners located along scheduled street sweeping routes, as well as vehicles parked within posted street sweeping zones.

POLICY

Section 1. Street Sweeping Scheduling. Manchester Borough shall establish seasonal street sweeping operations to maintain municipal roadways. Sweeping operations will typically occur during the spring season, generally between the months of March and May, with additional sweeping conducted as deemed necessary by the Borough. A street sweeping schedule shall be published through official municipal communication channels, which may include the municipal website, the Borough digital display, and other official Borough communications. The Borough reserves the right to modify or adjust the sweeping schedule due to weather conditions, emergencies, equipment availability, or other operational needs.

Section 2. Parking Restrictions. Temporary No Parking restrictions may be implemented during scheduled street sweeping operations in order to allow municipal crews to effectively clean roadways. Streets subject to sweeping operations shall be posted with signage indicating:

- a. The date(s) of sweeping;
- b. The applicable time frame of sweeping; and
- c. The applicable side(s) of the street where restrictions apply.

Residents and vehicle operators are responsible for removing vehicles from posted areas prior to the start of the scheduled sweeping period.

Section 3. Enforcement. Vehicles parked in violation of posted street sweeping restrictions may be subject to enforcement actions in accordance with corresponding Borough Ordinances. Enforcement shall be conducted by authorized Manchester Borough personnel. Such enforcement actions may include:

- a. The issuance of parking citations;
- b. The imposition of fines as established by Borough ordinance; and/or
- c. Towing when necessary to allow for the completion of sweeping operations.

Section 4. Weather and Operational Conditions. Street sweeping operations may be postponed or canceled due to weather conditions or operational circumstances that prevent effective or safe sweeping. These circumstances may include rain, snow, ice conditions, mechanical or equipment failure, or emergency municipal operations. When possible, updated information regarding schedule changes will be provided through official municipal communication channels.

Section 5. Resident Responsibilities. Residents are encouraged to assist in maintaining clean streets by:

- a. Avoiding placement of yard waste, leaves, or debris in roadways except during authorized municipal collection programs;
- b. Refraining from placing animal waste, bricks, limbs, or other damaging materials within leaf or debris piles;
- c. Sweeping sidewalks toward curb lines prior to scheduled sweeping operations; and
- d. Complying with posted signage and official Borough notices.

Section 6. Public Notice. Manchester Borough shall provide reasonable notice of street sweeping operations through one or more official communication methods. These methods may include the municipal website, official Borough social media channels, the Borough digital display, temporary posted signage, or other appropriate public announcements.

Section 7. Liability. Manchester Borough shall not be responsible for damage or inconvenience resulting from a failure to comply with posted parking restrictions or for debris displacement that may occur during normal street sweeping operations.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This policy shall take effect immediately upon adoption by Manchester Borough Resolution 2026-06 and may be amended from time to time as deemed necessary.

AUTHORITY

This policy is adopted under the authority granted to Manchester Borough pursuant to the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, including applicable municipal codes, traffic regulations, and stormwater management requirements.
